Pet ID Information for Oahu Residents

If your pet already has a microchip, update your contact information using the form below. If you plan to move off island, you may also want to register your microchip number with the maker of your microchip.

The Society is Oahu's official pet lost and found center, reuniting thousands of pets with their families each year.

Call the Hawaiian Humane Society Lost & Found at 356-2228 immediately to report a lost or found pet. You can also file a lost or found pet report at HawaiianHumane.org. Found animals should be brought to the Society's 24-hour

Admissions Center at 2700 Waiialae Avenue. If you've lost a pet, visit the Humane Society to check for your pet and bring a photograph and photo ID.

Dogs are required to wear a County-issued license tag on their collar at all times. A City & County of Honolulu dog license is what's considered legal proof of ownership. If your animal is lost, an ID can be your pet's ticket home. If the tag is lost, a replacement is available at no charge. Dog license applications are available at all satellite city halls, the Hawaiian Humane Society, and at HawaiianHumane.org.

Identification is required for all cats; sterilization is required for all cats over 6 months old that are allowed outdoors. The Humane Society recommends that cats be kept indoors to protect them from disease, danger and accidents.

Some landowners and community associations employ a trap and removal policy of all free-roaming cats.

The Hawaiian Humane Society also recommends that all dogs and cats wear an identification tag with your phone number. This can help you and your pet be reunited quickly.

A few simple steps could mean a lost pet has a far better chance of returning home.
