All dog parks require handlers to pick up after their pets so that all can enjoy a clean and safe environment. Parks are not suitable for puppies and completion of all vaccinations is required.

# Dog-Friendly Beaches & Parks



There is a national movement to open more public spaces to pets and people from restaurants to off-leash dog beaches.

## Dog Licensing

All dogs are required to *always* wear a current City & County of Honolulu license that establishes you as your pet's legal owner. Honolulu Police Department enforces this law and dog owners who fail to provide this identification can face penalties, including fines.



## Microchips

A microchip is permanent ID and if you've kept your contact information current with the Hawaiian Humane Society, we can contact you right away if your dog is lost and finds his way to us. ## Dogs in Cars

Dogs should never be left in cars unattended as temperatures can rise quickly. Call 911 to report any issue when people or animals are in immediate danger.

## Buckle Up

When riding with your pets in the back of a truck, it is the law to cross-tether them to prevent them from falling out. They must be secured at at least two points on opposite sides of the truck bed. It's against the law to drive with a pet in your lap.

## Dog-Friendly Beaches

Life's a beach for dogs whose owners know that there's nothing more enjoyable than a sunny afternoon of play in the ocean. Dogs may not be permitted in parks that front these beaches but it is allowable to quickly pass through them for beach access.

## Beach Safety for Dogs

Ensure to offer dogs plenty of fresh water and shade. Drinking ocean water can cause diarrhea or vomiting and lead to dehydration.

Dogs can get sunburned too, so limit sun exposure and apply a made-for-dogs sunblock to his ears and nose 30 minutes before going outside.

Running or swimming on the beach is rigorous exercise so watch for over-exertion.

Be aware of hazards such as boats, fishhooks, dead fish, garbage, hot sand and asphalt, lava rocks and broken glass.

## Beach Etiquette

- Dogs must be leashed on beach at all times but can be off leash swimming in the ocean.
- Take dogs home at the first sign of unfriendly behavior.
- Puppies and dogs should be vaccinated and healthy.
- Keep close supervision of your dog.
- Dogs in estrus/heat should be left at home.
- Pick up and dispose of your dog's waste.
